AMERICANS FOR TAX REFORM (ATR) TRACKS RESULTS FOR CANDIDATES BASED ON THEIR POSITION ON TAXES

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Already this year’s primary season has shown that voters take a strong interest in the position their candidates take on the issue of taxation: Across the nation, tax hikers or those who refused to rule out tax increases were sent into early retirement and replaced by fiscal conservative candidates.

The issue of higher taxes remains virulent for the general election, too. Not just at the federal level, the choices voters are faced with this year are starkly contrasting. In many districts, voters get to choose between tax-and-spenders on the one hand, and fiscal conservatives on the other.
