## Rep. Casada and Sen. Ketron to Chair Taxpayer Protection Caucuses in Tennessee

*-- State Rep. Glen Casada and Sen. Bill Ketron to take the lead in protecting Tennessee taxpayers' interests --*

WASHINGTON - Today, Americans for Tax Reform (ATR), America's leading taxpayer advocacy organization, announced that Representative Glen Casada and Senator Bill Ketron will become the Taxpayer Protection Caucus Chairs in their respective chamber in the Tennessee State Legislature.

To join the caucus, legislators must sign and keep the Taxpayer Protection Pledge, which is a written commitment to their constituents to "oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes." Every state (with the exception of Nebraska) will have both a Senate and House Taxpayer Protection Caucus, consisting of all pledge signers in the legislature. Currently, there are 38 Tennessee Pledge signers, 12 in the Senate, and 26 in the House.

**"Tennessee taxpayers are looking forward to seeing their position strengthened through the new caucuses that will represent their interests,"** said Grover Norquist, president of ATR. **"Under Representative Casada's and Senator Ketron's leadership, the new Taxpayer Protection Caucuses will fight so Tennessee families and businesses get to keep more of their hard earned money."**

The Taxpayer Protection Caucuses provide a single voice on tax issues among pro-taxpayer legislators, and form entire bodies of legislators that believe in the same principle: No new taxes. Considering the budget battles states are facing across the nation, taxes continue to be very high on the radar screen of the media. Journalists will be able to go to the chair of the respective caucus for comments on tax issues. Currently, there are 37 active caucuses operating in 23 states.

**"Protecting taxpayers should be the first priority of any legislator elected to a state legislature,"** Norquist continued. **"Representative Casada and Senator Ketron understand this important notion, and this is why they choose to take the lead in an effort to protect Tennessee taxpayers' wallets."**
