## Jill Holtzman Vogel Signs No-New-Taxes Pledge

*Candidate for Virginia State Senate commits to oppose and vote against  
any and all efforts to increase taxes*

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform applauds the pro-taxpayer platform of candidate Jill Holtzman Vogel (R). Ms. Holtzman Vogel is seeking the Republican nomination in the 27<sup>th</sup> senate district.

Ms. Holtzman Vogel demonstrated her dedication to the taxpayers of Virginia by signing the Taxpayer Protection Pledge on February 27<sup>th</sup>, 2007. By signing the Pledge, she commits to “oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes. The 27<sup>th</sup> senate district seat is currently held by Russell Potts (R), who broke the Pledge by voting for higher taxes and who is not seeking re-election.

**“Jill Holtzman Vogel joins numerous elected officials and candidates at the state and federal levels all of whom have committed themselves to the principles of limited government and fiscal restraint,”** said Grover Norquist, president of Americans for Tax Reform (ATR).

ATR offers the Taxpayer Protection Pledge to all candidates seeking office at the state and federal levels, and also to sitting incumbents.
