## Joseph F. Graziano Signs No-New-Taxes Pledge

*Candidate for Virginia State Senate commits to oppose and vote against  
any and all efforts to increase taxes*

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform applauds the pro-taxpayer platform of state legislative candidate Joseph F. Graziano (R). Mr. Graziano is running to represent voters in the 28<sup>th</sup> senate district. A firehouse primary to determine the Republican nominee for this district is scheduled for May 19<sup>th</sup>.

Mr. Graziano demonstrated his dedication to the taxpayers of Virginia by signing the Taxpayer Protection Pledge on May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2007. By signing the Pledge, he commits to “oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes.”
