Samuel D. Thompson Signs No-New-Taxes Pledge

**-- Assemblyman Samuel D. Thompson of New Jersey Commits to
Oppose Tax Increases --**

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Americans for Tax Reform applauds the pro-taxpayer platform of Assemblyman Samuel D. Thompson. He represents the voters of the 13th Assembly district in New Jersey.

Assemblyman Samuel Thompson demonstrated his dedication to the taxpayers of New Jersey by signing the Taxpayer Protection Pledge on March 14, 2005. By signing the Pledge, he commits “to oppose and vote against any and all efforts to increase taxes.”

As of today’s date, over 1240 state legislators have signed the Pledge. Six governors, four lieutenant governors, two attorneys general, four secretaries of state, three treasurers, 222 U.S. representatives, 46 U.S. senators, and President George W. Bush have also signed the Taxpayer Protection Pledge.

“Samuel Thompson joins numerous lawmakers and candidates at the state and federal levels who have committed themselves to principles of limited government,” commented Grover Norquist, President of ATR.

“I applaud Assemblyman Samuel Thompson for his commitment to all taxpayers of New Jersey. I extend the invitation to sign the Pledge to every candidate running for office, in the hopes that more elected officials will dedicate themselves to taxpayers, rather than tax-and-spending.”
